Happy Monday My Pros!

Ready to get your week started off right?

Let's do it . . . with this week's Tip of the Week . . . straight from a killer Inner Circle weekend we had here in NYC with my elite group of Pros and speakers.

One of those speakers was none other than Jack Viertel, author of <u>THE book</u> on writing musicals, "The Secret Life of the American Musical," as well as the Artistic Director of Encores, Tony Award- winner and so much more.

Because Jack has read and seen and CREATED a @#\$% ton of musicals and plays, I asked him what the most common flaw he has seen when he reads a new play or musical . . .

His answer?

"I often can't tell who the protagonist is. Who is the guy or gal that we are following on THIS story on THIS day who WANTS something desperately and will do anything to get it? I've got to know that and know that fast."

This advice coincides with where I see the most common problems in shows I cover (including my own!) . . . which is in the first 30 pages. Too many shows wander about, trying to set the scene *too* much and provide too much exposition. All that you need to do is:

- 1. Show (not tell!) us where we are.
- 2. Show us who we're supposed to root for.
- 3. Show us what we're rooting for that protagonist to go and get.

And then, just like I tell you to "Go get 'em" after every one of my emails . . . let that protagonist of yours, "GO GET 'EM!" Open the gates and let that horse of yours run toward his or her goal.

So this week's tip? Show your script . . . or just the first 30 pages even . . . to a friend. And when they are finished reading, ask them one question- "Who's my protagonist?"

If they can't answer you in the snap of a finger, you've got some rewriting to do.

And if you can't answer that question, well, you've got some rethinking to do.

Listen to Jack and make it super clear who the focus of your story is and fast.

Go get 'em!
