

Charlotte D. Jacobs is a professor of medicine at Stanford University. Mid-career, Jacobs began biography writing. *Henry Kaplan and the Story of Hodgkin's Disease*, was published in 2010; *The Wall Street Journal* called it one of the Best Five Books on doctors' lives. Jacobs' second biography, *Jonas Salk: A Life*, was published by Oxford University Press in 2015. It was called "a poignant and elegantly crafted look at a hero in decline" by *The New York Times* and "a sweeping and sympathetic narrative" by *The Wall Street Journal*. *Jonas Salk: A Life* was selected as "One of the 100 Notable Books of 2015" by editors of the *New York Times Book Review*. Jacobs was a finalist for the Los Angeles Times Book Award in biography and received a PROSE Award Honorable Mention from the Association of American Publishers.

In the meantime, Jacobs has 30 years of experience in regional theater, garnering several awards. With Michael Sally, Jacobs has co-authored [*Just My TYPE*](#), the book for a musical comedy based on the Myers-Briggs Type Indicator® assessment, with music and lyrics by Emmy winner Rita Abrams.
